Humana joins the Science Based Targets initiative and commits to working towards science-based climate targets

Humana has joined the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi) and commits to setting both a near-term climate target and a long-term net-zero target within 24 months. Through this commitment, Humana strengthens its efforts to contribute to reducing climate emissions and building a sustainable future in line with the goals of the Paris Agreement.

By joining SBTi, Humana's climate targets will be based on the latest scientific findings and validated by SBTi to ensure they align with the global goal of limiting global warming to 1.5 degrees. Humana's climate targets will be published once they have been reviewed and approved by SBTi.
